4. Explain what Jesus meant in verse 14 when He was talking to the man he had just healed. What did the man then do?

5. Who is the One who will judge? Where and how does He get His authority? (vs. 22, 24, 27)

4. What did the neighbors argue about after Jesus healed the blind man? Who settled the argument? (9:6-12)
5. Why was there a division among the Pharisees? What did the blind man think about Jesus? (9:13-17)
6. Why didn't the blind man's parents want to answer all of the Jews' questions? (9:18-23)

4. Comment on Martha's faith in Jesus and in the resurrection. What did Jesus mean when He said, "I am the resurrection and the life; he who believes in Me shall live even if he dies, and everyone who lives and believes in Me shall never die."? (11:17-29)

5. Comment on Mary's faith and the faith of some of the Jews. How was Jesus' affected by the trip to Lazarus' tomb? What comfort is this to us? (11:30-38)

6. When Jesus requested that the stone be removed from Lazarus tomb, what was Martha's reaction? How did Jesus respond? Why did Jesus pray to the Father to raise Lazarus? How did the Jews who saw Lazarus raised react? (11:39-46)

Lazarus' Resurrection: The Straw that Broke the Camel's Back (11:47-57)

7. How did the chief priests and the Pharisees react to the news of Lazarus' resurrection? In view of this where did Jesus go? (11:47-57)

QUESTIONS ON JOHN 12

Jesus Eats Supper in Bethany (12:1-11)

1. How costly was the perfume Mary anointed Jesus' feet with? What does this say about her love for Jesus? Who had a problem with what she did? Why? How did Jesus defend what Mary did? (12:1-8)
2. Why did a large crowd show up at the supper? What did the chief priests plan to do to Lazarus? Why? (12:9-11)

Jesus Is Welcomed into Jerusalem as King (12:12-20)

3. What did the large crowd who had come to Jerusalem for the Passover do to Jesus as he approached Jerusalem? How did Jesus come into Jerusalem? What did all of these things mean? When did the disciples understand this event? (12:12-16)
4. Why had such a large crowd come out to meet Jesus? How did the Pharisees react when they saw the large crowd? (12:17-19)

Why did Jesus' wash the disciples feet? In view of this, what should today's disciple do? Why did Jesus tell His disciples that one of them would betray Him? (13:6-20)

1. Why does chapter 14 begin with “Do not let your heart be troubled”? What does Jesus’ promise to prepare a place for His disciples have to do with what He said just prior to this? (14:1-4, cp. 13:31-38)
2. How did Jesus respond to Thomas when he said that the disciples did not know where Jesus was going or the way to get there? (14:5-6)
3. Jesus told His disciples that they had seen the Father. But Philip asked if the disciples could see the Father, as if they never had. How did Jesus reply? (14:7-11)
4. In what sense could the believer’s works be said to be “greater” than Jesus’ works? (14:12-14)
5. How could Jesus’ disciples show love for Him? How would the Father and Jesus react to such love? (14:15,18-24)
6. Who else would help the disciples? How would He help them? (14:16-17, 25-26).
7. What did Jesus leave with the disciples that would help them in the troublesome days ahead? How is this such a great blessing for us through our struggles? (14:27)
8. If Jesus’ disciples loved Him, how would they feel about His going away? Why did He tell them about it ahead of time? (How does this help us, too?) Why did Jesus do all that the Father commanded, even sacrificing Himself on the cross? (14:28-31)

2. What had Jesus done for the apostles? What did He ask for them in view of His going to the Father? (17:6-12)
3. Why did Jesus speak what He did in the world? How would what He prayed produce this effect on His apostles’ lives? (17:13)
4. Why did the world hate Jesus’ apostles? As the apostles faced a world that hated them, what did Jesus ask the Father to do for them? (17:14-19)
5. What kind of unity did Jesus pray would exist between Jesus’ apostles and all who believed on Him through their word? What effect would this have on the world? What is the state of unity among professed disciples of Jesus today? What is the effect on the world? (17:20-21)

QUESTIONS ON JOHN 18

JESUS IS BETRAYED AND ARRESTED (18:1-14)

1. How awful was it that Judas betrayed Jesus in this garden? Think of the meetings Judas had participated in there with Jesus and the other apostles. Think of the times of teaching and prayer at this quiet, secluded spot. (18:1-3)
2. Why did the heavily armed men who came to arrest Jesus back up and fall to the ground when He said, "I am He"? (18:4-6)
3. What did Peter do with his sword? What was Jesus' response? (18:7-11)
4. Why was Jesus led to Annas first and then to Caiaphas? (18:12-14, 24)

JESUS IS TRIED BEFORE ANNAS, CAIAPHAS, AND PILATE (& DENIED BY PETER) (18:15-40)

5. Tell the sad story of Peter's three denials of Jesus before the rooster crowed (18:15-27)
6. Why did the officer of the high priest strike Jesus? How did He reply? (18:19-23)
7. How ironic is it that those who wanted to kill an innocent man did not want to enter into Pilate's judgment hall so they would not be defiled and miss the Passover? How is it that religious people can be this way, then and now? (18:28)
8. What charge did the Jewish leaders bring against Jesus? What kind of kingdom did He (and does He) have? How could Pilate see that this was true? Answer Pilate's question, "What is truth?" (18:29-38)
9. How did Pilate try to get Jesus (& himself) "off the hook"? What did the Jews think of his idea? (18:39-40)

QUESTIONS ON JOHN 19

PILATE SENTENCES JESUS TO DEATH (19:1-16)

1. What does it mean to “scourge” someone? Describe the way the soldiers and Pilate humiliated Jesus. Did Pilate want to crucify Jesus? Why did the Jews say that He had to die? (19:1-7)

2. When Pilate rebuked Jesus for not answering the one who had life and death authority over Him, what was Jesus’ reply? Pilate wanted to release Jesus, but what did the Jews keep saying that caused him to give in and have Him crucified anyway? (19:8-16)

JESUS SUFFERS AND DIES ON THE CROSS (19:17-30)

3. What inscription did Pilate put on the cross? What did the chief priests want it changed to? What was Pilate’s reply? (19:17-22)

4. What did the soldiers do with Jesus’ clothing? What Scripture did this fulfill? Who was standing by the cross? Who did Jesus tell to take care of his mother? (19:23-27)

5. What Scripture was fulfilled when Jesus drank of the sour wine? Name some things that were finished when Jesus died. (19:28-30)

JESUS IS PIERCED AND THEN TAKEN OFF THE CROSS AND BURIED (19:31-42)

6. Why didn’t the Jews want the bodies of Jesus and the two thieves to remain on the cross? Again, what kind of “religious” people were they, to be concerned about something like this, while they had no problem murdering an innocent man? What Scriptures did the soldiers fulfill when they saw that Jesus was dead. (19:31-37)

7. Who were the men now willing for others to know of their faith in Jesus and their love for Him? How and where was Jesus buried? (19:38-42)

QUESTIONS ON JOHN 20

JESUS' ULTIMATE SIGN: HE RAISES FROM THE DEAD AND APPEARS TO THE DISCIPLES

1. What did Mary Magdalene see at Jesus' tomb and what did she do? Later, what was she doing when she was back at the tomb again? What was her response to the angels and to Jesus when they asked her why she was weeping? When did she recognize Jesus? What did Jesus tell her to do? (20:1-2, 11-18)
2. What did John (the other disciple whom Jesus loved) see when he got to the tomb? What did Peter see when he went into the tomb? What did John do when he came into the tomb for a closer look? How does what John and Peter found in the tomb argue against someone stealing the body of Jesus? Prior to this time did John and Peter understand that the Scriptures predicted that the Christ would rise again from the dead? How does this argue against the claim of the Jewish leaders that the disciples stole Jesus' body (Mt 28:11-15)? (20:3-10)
3. What were the disciples doing for fear of the Jews? How does this argue against their stealing the body? How did the disciples react when they saw Jesus? (20:19-20)
4. What was Jesus going to do to the disciples that the Father had done to Him? What did Jesus mean when he told the disciples "Receive the Holy Spirit" after breathing on them? Whose sins could they forgive and retain? (20:21-23)
5. What did Thomas say that it would take for him to believe in Jesus' resurrection? What did Jesus tell Him to do? What was his reaction? (20:24-28)
6. Who did Jesus say are blessed? Why did John write the signs that he did in his book? (20:29-31)

QUESTIONS ON JOHN 21

JESUS SHOWS HIS DISCIPLES WHO HE IS BY A MIRACLE: GREAT CATCH OF FISH (21:1-14)

1. The third time that Jesus manifested Himself to His disciples, how did He prove that He was the Lord, the same person they had followed for three years, now risen from the dead? (21:1-14)

JESUS ASKS PETER IF HE LOVES HIM, ASSIGNS HIM WORK, PREDICTS HIS DEATH (21:15-23)

2. Why was Peter grieved that Jesus asked him three times, "Do you love Me?" How was Peter to show his love for Jesus? (21:15-17)
